NFHS Softball - DP/FLEX Simplified

1.	A DP does not have to be used.	7.	If the starting DP plays defense for the FLEX player, the FLEX player has left the game and the team continues with 9 players.
2.	If used it must be noted on the starting lineup.	8.	The FLEX player can bat or run, but only in the original DP's position. Therefore, the FLEX player and the DP can never be on offense simultaneously.
3.	A team using the DP starts the game with 10 players on the lineup card, but could end the game with 9 or 10.	9.	When the FLEX player bats for the DP , the FLEX player bats in position of the original DP . The DP is considered to have left the game, but the FLEX player has not.
4.	The STARTING DP can play defense for any of the other 9 players in the lineup.	10.	If the DP re-enters the game, she must do so in her original batting order position and the FLEX player could: (A) move back to the No. 10 position in the lineup, or (B) leave the game. If the FLEX player moves back to the 10 th position in the lineup, the team resumes the game with 10 players and the FLEX player has never left the game.
5.	If the starting DP plays defense for a player listed within the first 9 batting positions in the lineup, that player will continue to bat in her original position in the lineup and has not left the game.	11.	A substitute can enter the game for either the DP or the FLEX position. The substitute can enter on defense, or as a pinch hitter or pinch runner.
6.	The player listed in the 10 th position in the lineup will play defense only and will be called a FLEX player. The DP and the FLEX player can play defense simultaneously.		

REMINDERS:

- 1) The DP can never be on DEFENSE ONLY.
- 2) The FLEX player can never be on OFFENSE ONLY.
- 3) The DP and FLEX player can never be on offense at the same time.
- 4) The STARTER and the SUBSTITUTE cannot be in the game at the same time.
- 5) The starting DP and FLEX player have one re-entry just as any other player.
- 6) Once the game is started with the DP/FLEX positions in the lineup, those positions are available for the entire game.
- 7) The penalty for illegal re-entry of the DP or FLEX player is always restriction to the bench/dugout.
- 8) If the player is on offense, she is called out. If the player is on defense, the team on offense may have the choice of taking the result of the play or accepting the penalty.

TROUBLESOME RULE

- **1.** Use of the DP-FLEX is optional and not mandatory.
- 2. The DP is the designated player who may bat anywhere in the batting order from 1-9. The FLEX is the flexible player and is listed in the 10th position in the line-up. The FLEX may not bat in the 10th position.
- **3.** The DP-FLEX roles may be suspended but are never terminated.
- **4.** The DP may play defense for any player, including the FLEX player.
- **5.** When the DP plays defense for any player in the batting order, that player will continue to bat but not play defense.
- **6.** When the DP plays defense for the FLEX, the FLEX must leave the game.
- 7. The FLEX and all substitutes for the FLEX may enter the batting order as a batter or runner only in the DP position. The change suspends the 10th position in the line-up.
- **8.** Courtesy runners may not be used for the DP if the DP is batting for the pitcher or catcher, but a pinch runner may be used.
- **9.** The starting DP, the starting FLEX and any substitutes for the DP and FLEX may leave the game and re-enter the game once.
- **10.** A starting FLEX and a substitute for the FLEX may not be in the game at the same time.
- **11.** The DP and the FLEX may play defense at the same time.
- **12.** The DP may play defense for any player and at any position.
- **13.** The DP and the FLEX may not play offense at the same time.
- **14.** A FLEX who enters the batting order and returns to FLEX is not considered to have left the game regardless of how many times such changes are made.
